The work activities are routine, performed under supervision, and within clearly defined guidelines.

No licensing, legislative, or certification requirements apply to this qualification at the time of publication.

ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To gain entry into ACM20121 Certificate II in Animal Care, candidates require the following:

• Complete placement in an animal care facility for 20 days over their studies.**
