

# AHC32822 Certificate III in Rural Operations

## DESCRIPTION

This qualification describes the skills and knowledge for general job roles in agriculture, conservation land management, and other related rural industries.

Depending on the units selected individuals can be employed not only in the agriculture industry but also in other rural and regional sectors, and community organisations.

Job roles and titles vary across different industry sectors and may include:

- Machinery operator
- Vegetable/orchard worker
- Station hand
- Animal care worker
- Pastoral worker
- Animal attendant/stock person
- Rural services.

Individuals with this qualification perform tasks under broad supervision involving a broad range of skills that are applied in a variety of contexts, which will involve discretion and judgment in selecting and operating equipment, coordinating resources, and applying contingency measures during work.

No licensing, legislative, or certification requirements apply to this qualification at the time of publication.

## ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To ensure you have the right skills and support to succeed in your course, a Language, Literacy, and Numeracy (LL&N) evaluation helps identify any areas where you may need additional support to help you achieve your goals.

To gain entry into AHC32822 - Certificate III in Rural Operations, candidates are required to:

- be physically fit, active, and able to function effectively in a tropical environment, as this is a physically demanding course.
- students must have a work contract with an approved employer to undertake a traineeship.
