

RESEARCH AREAS

Contemporary Indigenous Knowledge, Governance and Science

This research focuses on collaborative approaches to working across Aboriginal and Western knowledge systems that help stakeholders ask difficult questions and achieve shared community, industry, and government goals. Our researchers have worked closely with Indigenous and non-Indigenous knowledge and governance authorities from Northern Territory communities, some for over 30 years, to build governance and leadership capacities.

Demography and Growth Planning

This research explores the causes and consequences of population changes in the Northern Territory and beyond. The research team comprises experienced analysts, modellers and applied population experts. They are recognised for their capabilities in analysing demographic and socio-economic data to explain and anticipate population dynamics shaping our societies, influencing our economies, and affecting policies or service provision. Researchers collaborate with stakeholders, clients, peers, and other universities in respectful partnerships.

Realist Research, Evaluation and Learning

The realist research, evaluation and learning initiative contributes to the effectiveness of policies and programs by developing, teaching, using and promoting realist research and evaluation (RR&E) methodology and methods. The research team contributes to social, environmental and economic well-being by improving the quality and use of research and evidence in policies and programs, focusing on human and community services and international development sectors.

Regional, Economic, Education and Workforce Development

This research focuses on solving problems linked to economic, education and workforce policy and program implementation in regional and remote northern Australia. The research team works across developing agile forms of pedagogy, training and education methods to reflect our unique location and challenges and with various sectors and organisations (public, private, NGOs).

Risk, Resilience and Sustainability

This interdisciplinary research team contributes new knowledge about the magnitude and complexity of challenges in human-environment relations, their causes, and the likely political, economic, and social consequences. In turn, our researchers develop practical responses that aim to support the development of resilient, adaptable, and sustainable communities.
