

# VTP418 Produce Screen Media

## DESCRIPTION

This course will provide you with the skills and knowledge required to prepare, set up and shoot different screen content using professional camera equipment in a single camera environment.

The course applies to those who usually work without supervision, either as employees of a production house or as freelancers on assignment. Individuals often need to collaborate with producers, directors, and production professionals to achieve the camera, sound, and lighting outcomes of the shoot.

## ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no entry requirements for this course however students will be required to:

- Have access to a basic production kit, including a sound recording device, vision recording device and a lighting device.
- Undertake an LLN assessment to determine individual support requirements, if applicable.

To ensure you have the right skills and support to succeed in your course, a Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LL&N) evaluation helps identify any areas where you may need additional support to help you achieve your goals.

Casuarina	One semester	Online and face-to-face.  Students can choose to attend classes on campus in Casuarina or completely external. All students will have access to Learnline to access training and assessment resources.

- content designers
- screen producers
- filmmakers
- social media producers

Further training pathways from this program include, but are not limited to, CUA40420 Certificate IV in Live Production and Technical Services, CUA41320 Certificate IV in Visual Arts, or qualifications in Screen and Media.
