It also teaches ways to plan language revitalization, including policies and case studies. - > 25 hours of self-study (through online learning materials)

Each 4-CP module runs for 6-weeks and involves:

- > 10-hour (two-day) Face to face/online workshop
- > 50 hours of self-study (through online learning materials)

Completion and Recognition:

- Completion of each module awards participants a Digital Badge.
- Participants who successfully complete the associated assessment tasks can apply for academic credit towards the Diploma of Arts/Bachelor of Arts.
